I am writing to acknowledge receipt of your email dated 3rd July 2023 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding data

On 4th July we contacted you via email as in order to continue with your request we require clarification on the specific questions you are referring to?

On the same day you replied via email with:

'Please refer to your response dated 2nd May. (20230502 FOI Response letter Obstetric data Covid final ref 749 2223b.pdf) It was you that stated some data only goes up to March 2022. Your grid supplied reflects this. I am asking that this now be updated to end of 2022 in line with the other data provided. This should be possible now April 2023 has passed thus then of the financial year'.

On 5th July 2023 we contacted you via email as we required further clarification on via Calendar year (which is what we previously supplied) OR Financial year? The original request was worded in such a way as to be 'Calendar year'

Please can you give figures for each of the last 5 years ie 2018-2022

Therefore the Numbers supplied are Jan-Dec

However – your reply

Thank you for your reply of 2nd May 2023. As the financial year has ended I will be grateful for the remaining data which should now be available for year end 2022 / 2023. Linked to FOI ref 749-2223b

On 17th July 2023 you replied via email with:

'I was working from your letter dated 2nd May 2023 Ref: FOIA Reference 2022/23-749b in which it was stated:

"March 2022 (this is a yearly dashboard so 2022/23 has not yet been released"

I am asking if there is data to end of year 2022 which I am assuming has now been released. I am sorry if I have misunderstood the nature of a 2022 - 2023 year data set but I was assuming this







particular set was run according to a financial year as opposed to calendar. For clarity, it is calendar vears that are most helpful to me.'

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

UHNM is NOT in a position to answer:- Section 12 exemption as detailed below

- Total maternal collapses / cardiac this would be maintained in individual patient notes and may not be coded (dependant on clinical diagnosis)
- Covid 19 vaccination vaccination status not reliably documented in our Maternity system therefore unable to accurately provide this data without accessing each individual patient record to confirm their 'status' at the time (of pregnancy / delivery)

I can neither confirm nor deny whether the information you have requested is held by the Trust in its entirety. This is because the information requested in some of your questions is not held centrally, but may be recorded in health records. In order to confirm whether this information is held we would therefore have to individually access all health records within the Trust and extract the information where it is present. We therefore estimate that complying with your request is exempt under section 12 of the FOI Act: *cost of compliance is excessive*. The section 12 exemption applies when it is estimated a request will take in excess of 18 hours to complete. We estimate that accessing and reviewing all health records and then extracting relevant information would take longer than the 18 hours allowed for.

In addition to the section 12 exemption the Trust is also applying section 14 (1) exemption: oppressive burden on the authority
