I am writing to acknowledge receipt of your email dated 13th November 2023 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding tourniquets

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

- Q1 The type and number of tourniquets used for venepuncture and cannulation annually in your Hospital Trust, specifically whether you use single use (disposable) or reusable tourniquets and what material they are made out of.
- A1 See below:
 - Two main standardised tourniquets used, one band type and one easy open lock.
 - Single use
 - information not held for what material they are made from
- Q2 If you use a mix of both, whether there is there any Trust policy for deciding which tourniquet to use.
