I am writing in response to your email dated 26th March 2024 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding Mental Health Diagnosis.

On 28th March 2024 we contacted you via email with the following:
To continue with your request, we require clarification around what you mean by “presented in hospital”

On 2nd April 2024 you replied via email with:

‘I’d like to find out how many young people show up in A&E (or urgent care) at a hospital for the reasons listed, as oppose to how many are being treated by mental health care provider’

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

Q1 How many young people aged 11 to 25 inclusive presented in hospital with a mental health diagnosis in calendar years 2019, 2021 and 2023?

Please include diagnoses with the following ICD-10 codes in any diagnostic position:

- **F20-29: Schizophrenia, schizotypal and delusional disorders**
- **F30-39: Mood disorders**
- **F40-49: Neurotic, stress-related and somatoform disorders**
- **F50-59: Behavioural syndromes associated with physiological disturbances and physical factors**
- **F60-69: Disorders of adult personality and behaviour**
- **F90-98: Behavioural and emotional disorders with onset usually occurring in childhood and adolescence**
- **F99: Unspecified mental disorder**
- **G47: Disorders of initiating and maintaining sleep [insomnias]**
- **Z91.5: Personal history of self-harm**

A1 UHNM is unable to answer as we do not use in ED ICD10 diagnosis clinic coding, we use the ED SNOMED CT diagnosis coding therefore we are unable to identify the patients requested.
