I am writing in response to your email dated 26<sup>th</sup> March 2024 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding Sample Tracking System.

As of 1<sup>st</sup> November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

Q1 I would like to make an FOI request for the following data please:

Which, if any, 'sample tracking system' is used in your histology (histopathology) service.

- A1 Roche Vantage (laboratory tracking)
- Q2 If applicable, the cost of the respective sample tracking systems used.
- A2 See below:

Capital cost: £106215 (2018/19)

- Q3 The total number of reported lost histology (histopathology) specimens, from within pathology dating from 2020-present date.
- A3 2 cases; whereby the retained tissue was not available to be re-sampled for extra blocks
- Q4 The average time spent searching for further work requested blocks.
- A4 8.5 hours per day
