## Dear

I am writing to acknowledge receipt of your email dated 17th January 2022 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding on response for Guillain Barre Syndrome.

## You stated:

'So you are telling me that UHNM makes and keeps no record in any way at all if it yellow cards a patient to the MHRA? It is also the case that if the trust sees a series of patients that it doesn't take any note or assess further. It doesn't advise clinicians of a possible trend in cases and that they should be aware of something on clinical presentation?

If so, such a system would not fill me with confidence that we are keeping across adverse effects from vaccination.'

## Our response:

Careflow (clinical system) does not record if there was a yellow card occurrence nor does it hold a person's vaccination status as this is held by the person's GP record to which we do not have access. You asked specifically about Guillain Barre Syndrome (We can identify the patients diagnosed using the following clinical code: G610 - Guillain-Barré syndrome) there have been 45 patients discharged and diagnosed with Guillain Barre Syndrome since January 2020. However, if all these case notes were pulled and checked for those patients who had been vaccinated with the Astra Zeneca jab it would be impossible for a clinician to state that the discharge was *definitely* caused by the vaccine. Therefore our response below which re-directed you to Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency was correct.

The web page provided states all issues with vaccination

As of 1<sup>st</sup> November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHNM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

- I would like to request, using the Freedom of Information Act, how many patients that University Hospitals North Midlands has identified with Guillain Barre Syndrome which has been associated with vaccination with the Astrazeneca-Oxford vaccine and the severity of their disease.
