I am writing in response to your email dated 11th December 2020 requesting information under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) regarding SIRO contacts

As of 1st November 2014 University Hospitals of North Midlands NHS Trust (UHM) manages two hospital sites – Royal Stoke University Hospital, and County Hospital (Stafford). Therefore the response below is for the two sites combined from that date where appropriate.

Q1 Under the Freedom of Information Act, can you please provide the following information?

- 1. The name of a Non-Executive Director who has responsibility for advising on Clinical Risk and/or Information Risk**
- 2. The name of you Head of Risk Register (or equivalent)**
- 3. The name of your Senior Information Risk Officer (SIRO)**
- 4. The name of the contact responsible for Clinical Risk**
- 5. The name of your Clinical Safety Advisor**

A1 Please see below:

1. Non-Executives are not responsible for advising – rather holding the executive to account and offering constructive scrutiny and challenge. The Executive Directors responsible for clinical risk are the Chief Nurse and Medical Director. The Executive Director responsible for information risk is the Director of IM&T.
2. We don't have a specific head for the risk register. Risk management arrangements are led by the Corporate Governance Team, with the overall accountable officer being the Chief Executive.
3. Mark Bostock. The Director of IM&T is our SIRO.
4. As above, per answer 1.
5. We do not have any role/post clinical safety advisor so this is not applicable.

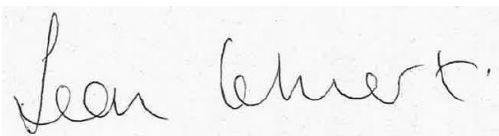
